Completed all courses listed for a major will earn you an Associates Degree. Once you transfer to a 4 yr. TN state school those credits will be accepted.

Top Reasons Students Don't Graduate On Time

Too Many Work Hours.

Students who work more than 25 hours a week struggle to keep a 3.0 or above GPA.

Falling Behind/Lack of Study Skills

College requires more studying between classes. A low GPA could cause you to lose financial aid or be put on academic probation.















No Social Life

If you don't enjoy something you will not stick with it

Taking classes not in your major/minor.

Each program of study requires certain classes (general education and major specific) to be taken in order to receive your degree.

Tips to Graduate on Time

Too many work hours

Limit the amount during the semester by applying to scholarships and earning more money over summer and breaks

Falling Behind/ Study Skills

College is different from high school in many ways, especially academically. Use your syllabus to know what to study and when classes are schedules. Sign up for tutoring at the first sign of trouble. You don't want to jeopardize financial aid or having to retake classes you failed and not graduate on time.

No Social Life

Join something that you are interested in. Even community colleges have clubs and campus events. Let's check out the clubs organizations page for your top choice school.


Taking the Wrong Classes




Ways A Syllabus Can Save Your Grade





Who, When, Where, How... to contact your professor



What is Covered

Topics, readings, videos etc. required before each class.



What makes up your gradetests, presentations, papers?
Attendance/ Make Up work policies and how/where to turn in your work.

Policies



Due Dates

When are assignments.
Tests, quizzes, papers.
Presentations etc. due.
Finish work ahead of time
to keep grades up.

Helpful Classmates

Keep your grade up

What percentage of your grade is made up by: exams, quizzes, participation, papers, presentations, final exam? Set up a study plan.

Keep up with due dates

Make a list of what is due and when. Then keep track of the grade received so you can estimate your grades.

Organization
